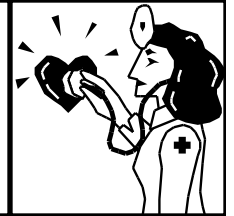

Displays in the Archives room were set up to showcase our NurseMADE donations for California Hospital's NICU/Peds/ER, and to gather any donated clothing for needy patients. In addition to our archival displays, and merchandise, we debuted a new Commemorative April 2011-April 2012 California Hospital School of Nursing Alumni Association calendar.

We found out later, that a group of our CHSN faculty were meeting upstairs for a brunch meeting—one so entertaining that the attendees almost forgot to come down to our luncheon and business meeting! Oh, to be a fly on the wall during that brunch! During the Luncheon, our guest faculty agreed that despite teaching at other facilities/institutions, there was no comparisons! Worked Southern Minnesota in 30 bed hospital with lots of OBs: 1 RN/Labor & Delivery, Post-Partum, C-Section, Nursery. Worked 32½ years OB, then 4 years Home Nursing. Retired 2 years ago.

Patricia (Carr) Pitt: Went into nursing out of high school from a small town. Big experience in LA: worked 20 bed hospital as only RN on Nocs. Delivered babies, called MD, pronounced patients. Married in 1963 and moved to Redding. Worked OR x 3 years as PM Supervisor. 1st hubby died, remarried 1½ years later. Worked as Office RN x 17 years Full time, plus fill-in after. When FP MD retired in 2000, Internal Med MD practice now. Still doing fill-in office nursing, averaging 2-4 days/month, seeing the whole patient and family.
